risk stratification, and treatment of common cardiovascular conditions. The content will provide participants with a thorough understanding of the value of integrated, multidisciplinary approaches in the management of cardiovascular diseases.

## curricular goals and objective

**Understand the occurrence, impact, and outcomes of common cardiovascular conditions.**

*Upon completion of this activity, participants should be able to:*

- Describe how risk stratification can be utilized to appropriately decide upon the need for, and mode of coronary revascularization in patients with stable coronary artery disease;
- Identify process pathway treatment parameters important for the optimal management of STEMI; and
- Review the current guideline based approaches and goals for the management of hypertension and hyperlipidemia.

**Identify a rational approach to the initial diagnosis and evaluation of patients with common cardiovascular conditions.**

*Upon completion of this activity, participants should be able to:*

- Discuss the factors to consider in determining timing of intervention for aortic

stenosis and mitral regurgitation;

- Describe a rational approach to the use of noninvasive cardiac imaging based on clinical presentation and patient related factors; and
- Summarize the initial approach to diagnosis and treatment of congestive heart failure.

**Describe contemporary management strategies for common cardiovascular conditions.**

*Upon completion of this activity, participants should be able to:*

- Recognize current approaches to anticoagulation for venous thromboembolism, including recommended duration of therapy;
- Describe the initial approach to the management of atrial fibrillation, including anticoagulation for prophylaxis of thromboembolism; and
- Summarize indications for the types of repair for aortic aneurysms/dissection.
