Dr. John A. Abraham is an Orthopedic Surgeon at Brigham & Women's Hospital specializing in Orthopedic Oncology. He graduated from Harvard University, Magna Cum Laude in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, and Yale University School of Medicine with High Honors, and was elected to the Alpha Omega Alpha Honors Medical Society. He completed his orthopedic residency training at the Harvard Combined Orthopedic Surgery program and was awarded the William H. Thomas Award, given to the senior resident best exemplifying excellence in orthopedics, patient care, collegiality, and teamwork. He went on to pursue Oncology subspecialty training in the Harvard Orthopedic Oncology Fellowship program. He has since held staff appointments in Orthopedic Surgery at the Brigham and Women's/Dana Farber Cancer Center.

Dr. Abraham is currently an Instructor of Orthopedic surgery at Harvard Medical School and pursues active research with particular interest in the development of new surgical techniques such as computer-assisted navigation surgery for the management of difficult musculoskeletal tumors such as pelvic sarcomas. He has presented his work at both national and international forums such as the Musculoskeletal Tumor Society, the International Society on Limb Salvage, and The Connective Tissue Oncology Society. He has authored numerous original articles, expert review articles, and book chapters focusing on musculoskeletal oncology, and has been an invited speaker to national meetings in both Medical Oncology and Radiation Oncology sarcoma subspecialty conferences.
